REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MINUTES August 5, 2021

The regular meeting of the Village Board of Hampshire was called to order by Village President Michael J. Reid, Jr. at 7:00 p.m. in the Village of Hampshire Village Board Room, 234 S. State Street, on Thursday, August 5, 2021.

Roll Call by Village Clerk Vasquez:

Present: Heather Fodor, Aaron Kelly, Toby Koth, Lionel Mott, Laura Pollastrini, Erik Robinson. Absent: None

A quorum was established.

Also, present in person were Village Manager Jay Hedges, Village Clerk Linda Vasquez, Finance Director Lori Lyons, Assistant to the Village Manager Josh Wray, and Village Attorney Mark Schuster. Also, present electronically: Tim Paulson – EEI.

President Reid led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Carl Palmisano thanked everyone for making this year's Coon Creek Country Days the best festival ever. There were no issues reported; everything went very smoothly. The next Coon Creek Committee meeting will be August 17 at 7:15 p.m. at the Village Hall. All are welcome to provide input/feedback.

Trustee Pollastrini moved to approve the minutes of July 15, 2021, with changes.

VILLAGE MANAGER'S REPORT

<u>A motion to appoint Susie Kopacz to the Business Development Commission for a Three</u> (3) Year Term.

President Reid introduced BDC Chairman Ryan Krajecki who conducted interviews with the two candidates for this seat. Both President Reid and Chairman Krajecki recommended Susie Kopacz. Chairman Krajecki added that she has been with the BDC for 3 years and has been one of the most significant contributors.

Trustee Koth moved to appoint Susie Kopacz to the Business Development Commission for a Three (3) Year Term.

Seconded by Trustee Kelly Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini, Robinson Nays: None Absent: None

<u>A Motion to Approve a Raffle for White Riders Snowmobile Club for (3) Cash Prizes</u> Totaling \$2,300.

Trustee Pollastrini moved to approve a raffle for White Riders Snowmobile Club for (3) cash prizes totaling \$2,300.

Seconded by Trustee Mott Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini, Robinson Nays: None Absent: None

<u>A Motion to Approve an Agreement for Water Supply Services at 17N075 Harmony Road,</u> <u>Hampshire Township</u>

Trustee Kelly asked why the agreement included only \$5 per month for capital improvement fees as opposed to \$10, to which Finance Director Lyons responded it is because they are only paying for water and not also sewer.

Trustee Koth moved to approve an agreement for Water Supply Services at 17N075 Harmony Road, the Dieckman Property.

Seconded by Trustee Fodor Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini, Robinson. Nays: None Absent: None

<u>A Motion to Approve the Façade Improvement Grant to Ambrose Seyller for the Property</u> at 165 State Street for 75% of the Total Project Cost of \$41,450 or \$31,087.50.

Trustee Kelly reported there was discussion at the BDC meeting whether the proposed work to the rear of the building facing the alley should be included. That discussion resulted in a 3-2 vote from the BDC. The two nays were because the alley portion was included in the motion made at the BDC meeting. BDC Chairman Krajecki added that the three aye votes were because the alley-facing improvements are actually visible from Washington St. Trustee Koth suggested the BDC make the program guidelines more clear.

Trustee Robinson moved to approve the Façade Improvement Grant to Ambrose Seyller for the property at 165 State Street for 75% of the total project cost of \$41,450 or \$31,087.50.

Seconded by Trustee Koth Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini, Robinson. Nays: Kelly Absent: None Trustee Kelly noted that his nay vote here was to be consistent with his vote at the BDC, but he supports the project.

<u>A Motion to Approve the Façade Improvement Grant to Kelly Zopfi for the property at 148</u> Washington for 50% of the Total Project cost of \$61,255, or \$30,680.

Trustee Kelly noted that the BDC voted to fund this project with everything left in the program budget, which resulted in 50% of the project cost. The BDC would have liked to fund it at 75% but FY2022 funds are now fully committed.

Trustee Robinson asked if any other applications will be coming in, to which Trustee Kelly responded that there are no other known applications.

Trustee Kelly moved to approve the Façade Improvement Grant to Kelly Zopfi for the property at 148 Washington for 50% of the total project cost of \$61,255, or \$30,680.

Seconded by Trustee Robinson Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Mott, Pollastrini, Koth, and Robinson Nays: None Absent: None

A Motion to Accept the Low Bid and Approval of the Award for the Julie Lane Resurfacing Project to Peter Baker and Sons, Co. of Lake Bluff, IL in the Amount of \$148,136.70.

Trustee Kelly asked if there is any concern about this lowest bid being an outlier since all other bids were much higher. Tim Paulsen from EEI responded that EEI is not concerned since this is a good company. He explained that contractors can have holes in their schedules this time of year, so they likely bid low to be as competitive as possible in order to keep their people busy.

Trustee Pollastrini asked if there is a timeline for this project. Mr. Paulsen responded that there would not be an official timeline until the contract is awarded, but the anticipated period is September to early October.

Trustee Fodor asked about resident notification. Village Manager Hedges said the Streets Department would notify affected residents. Residents will have access to their driveways throughout the duration of the project.

Trustee Fodor moved to accept the low bid, and approval of the award for the Julie Lane Resurfacing project to Peter Baker and Sons, Co. of Lake Bluff, IL in the amount of \$148,136.70.

Seconded by Trustee Pollastrini Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini and Robinson. Nays: None Absent: None

Building Report

Assistant to the Village Manager Wray provided a monthly building report highlighting the number and types of permits issued, value added to the Village, fees collected, and special notes about certain projects.

Streets Report

The packet included a monthly Streets Dept. report from Streets Supervisor Dave Starrett. Village Manger Hedges made one special note that the department saved the Village \$8,799 by using the new street sweeper to clean catch basins rather than contracting this work out as in the past.

Treasurer's Report

Finance Director Lyons provided a monthly financial report highlighting current revenues and expenses to date compared to budgeted numbers expected at this time of the year. She noted that use tax revenue is lower than budgeted, but that number is very difficult to predict at budget time; places for eating tax revenue is lower than budget because the new tax did not start until July; admin capital outlay expenses are higher than budget because the branding work done in the board room was not budgeted; and the IEPA loan accounting always looks odd because of timing, but it will be exactly on track at the end of the fiscal year.

A Motion to Approve the August 5, 2021 Accounts Payable to Personnel.

Trustee Robinson moved to approve the Accounts Payable for Nicholas Orsolini and Linda Vasquez in the sum of \$64.64 00 paid on or before August 11, 2021.

Seconded by Trustee Kelly Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini and Robinson. Nays: None Absent: None

A Motion to Approve the August 5, 2021 Regular Accounts Payable

Trustee Koth asked if the Village had recouped money for police overtime at the Kave. Village Manager Hedges replied no, but the costs were \$2,400. He will be meeting with the owners of the Kave to review the financial results of the event before determining how much will be billed to the Kave, and what contribution the Village might make, given the popularity of event with downtown businesses as co-sponsors, and with Hampshire Residents. Village Manager Hedges added that we want to work with the Kave for similar events in the future.

Trustee Kelly asked about the water-leak detection expense. Finance Director Lyons explained this is part of the Village-wide leak detection survey budgeted for this year. Mr. Hedges added that leak detection would occur every other year from now on to reduce the cost of treatment of unbilled water loss, and to conserve water.

Trustee Mott moved to approve the Accounts Payable in the sum of \$222,365.99 paid on or before August 11, 2021.

Seconded by Trustee Fodor Motion carried by roll call vote. Ayes: Fodor, Kelly, Koth, Mott, Pollastrini and Robinson. Nays: None Absent: None

Trustee Kelly asked about the status of staff assuming responsibility for social media posts. Village Manager Hedges responded that the PR Committee had asked staff to seek candidates for a social media intern to assist with the Village's digital marketing, including social media posts.

Pursuant to Board comments, PetAg's Representative notified the impacted residential owners in the neighborhood, and attempted to reach each by telephone. See attached letters.

Action(s) Needed

A. Review and enact an Ordinance Amending the Regulations Prohibiting Use of Groundwater as a Source of Potable Water Supply (in the area of the Village adjacent to the PetAg facilities on Keyes Avenue).

No. 21- ____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REGULATIONS PROHIBITING THE USE OF GROUNDWATER AS A SOURCE OF POTABLE WATER SUPPLY IN CERTAIN TERRITORY LOCATED WITHIN THE VILLAGE

WHEREAS, certain properties in the Village of Hampshire, Illinois have been used over a period of time for commercial / industrial purposes, including use and/or dispensing of gasoline and fuels; and

WHEREAS, because of said use, concentrations of certain chemical constituents in the groundwater beneath the Village may exceed Class I groundwater quality standards for potable resource groundwater, as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 620, or Tier 1 remediation objectives as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 742; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to limit potential threats to human health from groundwater contamination, while facilitating the redevelopment and productive use of properties that are the source of said chemical constituents; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have previously enacted certain regulations prohibiting the use of groundwater as a source of potable water supply, through water supply wells, or by any other methods, in regard to certain territory in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities are advised and understand that this ordinance may be treated as an Institutional Control for purposes of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it necessary and advisable at this time to revise and add to the territory that shall be subject to such restrictions in the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as previously amended, shall be and is further amended to add additional provisions to Section 8-5-2 of the Village Code, pertaining to regulations governing the use of groundwater as a potable water supply and other related restrictions in regard to certain territory in the Village, in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 8	WATER AND SEWER

- 1. PIN: 01-02-100-005 (commonly known as Hampshire Oasis, or CITGO Gas Station located at 19 N 479 US Highway 20, Hampshire, Illinois;
- 2. PIN: 01-02-300-001, commonly known as Travel Centers of America. HTP TA Properties LLC (TA Elgin #044), located at 19N430 US Highway 20, Hampshire, Illinois,
- 3. Illinois DOT US Highway 20, adjoining the site.

A map of the area governed by this subsection is on file with the Village Clerk, labeled as Ordinance No. 16 - 24, §8-5-2, Exhibit "A." Property index numbers listed herein are those in effect as of the date of adoption of Ordinance No. 16-24 and any future modifications thereof shall be deemed included herein by reference.

Section 4. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or under any circumstances is adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or of any portion not adjudged invalid.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form, as required by law.

While Pet-Ag is not aware of any household wells in the area, a Village ordinance prohibiting the installation or use of household potable water wells in the area near the Site is a part of the planned environmental response.







Background

As part of its second addition to its main facility at 200 Brandt Drive, including construction of a parking lot for its expanded facility, Stanley/TRZ made an agreement with its neighbor, NCI, to utilize an existing detention/retention facility on the NCI property for stormwater management purposes.

Pursuant to the Kane County Stormwater Regulations (adopted by the Village in Ch. 11 of the Village Code), Stanley/TRZ is required to consent to a back-up Special Service Area to assure future maintenance of the stormwater management facility. (Note: Because this detention/retention area preexisted the adoption of the County Stormwater Regulations, no back-up Special Service Area has previously been established; because the facility is now being incorporated into the present drainage plans for the Stanley/TRZ new building, the back-up SSA is now required).

NCI and TRZ have joined to apply for this Special Service Area, and have made an underlying agreement between themselves concerning the primary obligation for maintenance. (Amendment of Easement and Maintenance Agreement by and between TRZ and NCI, dated March 14, 2018, recorded as Doc. No. 2018K13663).

A map showing the area of the detention facility is attached.

A public hearing regarding the proposal must be held "...not less than 60 days after the adoption of the ordinance proposing the establishment of a special service area..." Notice of the hearing date shall be given to the property owners by mail and by publication. The Ordinance sets the public hearing date for October 7, 2021 [see Paragraph 1 in draft Ordinance], a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees.

WHEREAS, the Village may consider and establish certain special service areas within its municipal limits, pursuant to Article VII, Section 7(6) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and pursuant to the provisions of "An Act to provide the manner of levying or imposing taxes for the provisions of special service to areas within the boundaries of home rule units and non-home rule municipalities and counties," 35 ILCS 200/27-5 et seq.; and

- C. Said area will benefit specially from the following municipal services to be provided in the area, to wit:



Background. The IML provided a model ordinance to designate an authorized signor to facilitate executing the documents to secure and report on American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA) to be received from the US Treasury.

Analysis. The Village Manager, on behalf of the Village, has agreed to and submitted the US Department of the Treasury Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recover Fund Terms and Conditions as well as the Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights (Title VI) Requirements ARPA-documents to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity's (IDCEO) Non-Entitlement Unit Portal. ARPA funds are being administered by the State of Illinois through IDCEO. The Village's allotment is \$849,787.25 and the first trache payment (half) is expected soon.

Recommendation. It is recommended that the Board approve the Ordinance Pertaining to the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund which follows this agenda supplement, affirming the Village Manager as authorized signor to execute and deliver and, as necessary, the Clerk is hereby authorized to attest to said execution of said Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Award Terms and Conditions and Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements as incorporated hereto for and on behalf of the Village.

ORDINANCE NO. 21 – XX

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUND FOR THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE

WHEREAS, the Village of Hampshire, Kane County, Illinois, ("Village") is an Illinois municipality, eligible for funds through the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund through the U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury); and

WHEREAS, Treasury's Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund is authorized by Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, P.L. 117-2 ("ARPA"); and

WHEREAS, as a local government recipient of financial support through ARPA, the Village is required to utilize the financial support received from Treasury for the specific purposes and in compliance with the terms and conditions required by ARPA and Treasury regulations implementing ARPA; and

WHEREAS, Treasury requires the recipients of Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds maintain conflict of interest policies consistent with 2 C.F.R. § 200.318(c); and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village have determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interest of the Village to enter into the attached Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Award Terms and Conditions and provide the Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements in order to participate in and receive the funding pursuant to ARPA.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampshire as follows:

ARTICLE 1

The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE 2

The Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Award Terms and Conditions and Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements in substantially the form of the exhibit attached hereto is hereby incorporated herein by reference, authorized and approved.

ARTICLE 3

The Village adopts the following conflict of interest provisions that shall apply to all activities and expenditures funded through the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Award:

- 1. No officer, employee or agent of the Village may participate in the selection, award or administration of a contract supported by a Federal award if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict of interest would arise when the officer, employee, or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract.
- 2. The officers, employees and agents of the Village may neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties to subcontracts. However, the Village may set standards for situations in which the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is an unsolicited item of nominal value, consistent with the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act, 5 ILCS 430/1 *et seq*.
- 3. The violation of these standards of conduct may result in disciplinary action for violations of such standards by officers, employees or agents of the Village, in accordance with the policies, employment contracts, contracts for services or collective bargaining agreements of the Village.
- 4. The Village shall award contracts only to responsible contractors possessing the ability to perform successfully under the terms and conditions of a proposed procurement. Consideration will be given to such matters as contractor integrity, compliance with public policy, record of past performance, and financial and technical resources.
- 5. The Village shall disclose in writing to Treasury any potential conflict of interest affecting the awarded funds in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.112.

ARTICLE 4




