The Village of Hampshire, in collaboration with the Hampshire Fire Protection District, is pleased to announce the adopt a hydrant program. Interested artists (no residency requirements) will be permitted to "adopt" fire hydrants within the village limits of Hampshire and create artistic designs for them. This season fire hydrants throughout Hampshire will be available for artists to paint. The goal of this program is to embrace the artistic talents of local individuals while displaying creative artwork throughout the community. There is no specific theme for this program. However, artists are encouraged to incorporate the character of the surrounding environment and neighborhood into their artwork. The Village of Hampshire along with the Hampshire Fire Protection District will award first, second, and third place winners for the best hydrant designs. There is no cost to apply for the program.

PROGRAM DETAILS

How can I participate in this program?

- Fill out the application/design proposal (page 2 of this form)
- Fill out the waiver (page 3 of this form)
- Submit the required forms to the Village of Hampshire

How should I begin painting after receiving Village / Fire District approval?

- Remove all dirt, mud, and debris from the hydrant before painting
- Protect the immediate area around the hydrant from paint stains
- Use high quality, oil-based enamel paint for metal
- Painting will be allowed from May 1st through September 1st

What is prohibited on the hydrants?

- Inappropriate words, advertisements, political messages, etc.
- Glued or attached objects
- Camouflage or designs that significantly reduce hydrant visibility
- Please avoid using dark colors as they reduce hydrant visibility

Once I have finished painting my hydrant, what should I do?

- Participants will clear snow and debris away from the hydrant
- · Participants of the prgram will be recognized on the master list at the Hampshire Fire Department
- Maintain your hydrant's artistic design for up to one year



From the community: Geneva's 'Art On Fire' Hydrant Design Contest Returns This Spring

eneva residents can leave their artistic mark on our community this spring by participating in the "Art on Fire" hydrant design program.

The City of Geneva, in collaboration with the Cultural Arts Commission, is seeking artists to "adopt" and paint fire hydrants. More than 50 hydrants have been painted the past two years as part of "Art on Fire," and the program has been well received by residents and visitors who have taken notice of the artwork in the downtown and surrounding areas.

With more than 1,800 fire hydrants throughout Geneva, plenty of "blank canvas" remains for artists to submit new entries this spring. "Art on Fire" was established by Mayor Kevin Burns in 2013 as a way to showcase Geneva's artistic talent and bring art into the community.

"The 'Art on Fire' program continues to ignite imagination, creativity and community participation," Mayor Burns said. "I look forward to the new designs that will soon be displayed on fire hydrants across Geneva."

The program is free and open to the public, but participants need to submit an application to the City by Friday, May 1. The application can be found on the City's website at www.geneva.il.us or picked up at Geneva City Hall, 22 S. First St.

"Art on Fire" does not mandate a specific theme, but the program encourages artists to incorporate the character of the hydrant's surrounding environment into their design. City staff reviews and approves all application designs to make sure they do not compromise the visibility of the hydrants for firefighters in an emergency. Artists will be allowed to paint their hydrants during the month of May.

The City's Public Arts Advisory Committee and Cultural Arts Commission will again judge the hydrants and award prizes to the top three design winners in June.

People can take a virtual tour of all the decorated hydrants on an interactive map posted on the City's website. The map will be updated this summer to include all the 2015 submissions.

Sen. Hwang Joins Jeanne Harrison, Community Volunteers for Fairfield Fire Hydrant Painting Project

FAIRFIELD – A small army of volunteers, brandishing paint brushes and armed with an unshakable desire to give back to the community, have converged on streets around town with a single mission: to pay homage to Fairfield's revolutionary history through a creative and fun project.

The targets are fire hydrants that line Fairfield's streets and their leader is the indefatigable Jeanne Harrison. On a recent afternoon, Sen. Tony Hwang (R-28) joined Harrison and a small group of volunteers to engage in this ongoing effort, transforming the often unsightly and overlooked hydrants into tiny Red Coat soldiers that have excited children and adults alike.

Joining Harrison and Sen. Hwang were Adam Plotnick, of Turney Road, and Pat McDonald, a retired Fairfield teacher and longtime resident. The group chatted and laughed as they painted a hydrant at the I-95 rest stop in Fairfield and later, while doing some touch-ups to one near Jennings Beach, Harrison retraced the origins of her "labor of love."

As the town prepared to celebrate our country's bicentennial in 1976, Harrison approached

then First Selectman John-J. Sullivan with her idea. Approvals were secured and Harrison was told she could start with a test – one hydrant.

Before she even finished that first hydrant, residents were calling the town asking how they could get the hydrant near their home painted, too.

The project quickly took on a life of its own and Harrison realized she was going to need help. She didn't have to look very far. Over the years, volunteers have come from Boy and Girl Scouts, Wakeman's Boys and Girls Club, and the Association of Retired Teachers of Fairfield.

Plotnick became involved when he asked Harrison if she would paint a hydrant near his house. "I'll do it if you help me," was her answer, Plotnick recalled. "I think they look great and I want to help Jeanne," he added, explaining his reasons for continuing to volunteer his time for the project.

"The love that people have for these hydrants, I never thought that would happen," said Harrison, who is now 83.

"This project truly represents all that is good about Fairfield and our residents," Sen. Hwang said. "It speaks volumes about Jeanne's character and the love she has for our community, and it also highlights the strong sense of volunteerism that the people of Fairfield have and the incredible appreciation we have for our town's rich and storied history."

Harping back to that history, some have asked Harrison why paint Red Coats and not the Patriots, given that the British burned nearly every home in town to the ground on their way to Danbury during the Revolutionary War.

"Now the British put the fires out," McDonald joked.


